

PULL-TABS PROGRAM NEWS

FREEDOM, NH, AUGUST 11, 2006--Working in close accord with Carroll County service clubs, Gail & Alan Stolz, owners of Camp Cody, are inviting all area residents and businesses to their home, 46 Gailan Dr., Freedom, on Monday, August 21st at 11:00 am. What's become a special summertime ceremony with the Simadi Shriners Club, whose Masonic Lodge members are from communities ranging from Rochester to Conway. The event supports Shriners children's burn & orthopedic clinics across the USA and Canada. Everyone is welcome-the admission price is a bag, box, or container, filled with any amount of pull-tabs,

Tabs are those handy openers atop so many varieties of cans that hold everything from beverages, pet & people foods, engine additives, tennis balls and more! These featherweight, scrap pull-tabs are collected by the MILLIONS. The aluminum is then smelted into ingots, and the valuable metal sold to raise funds for the youngsters needing care, and their special hospital equipment. There is no charge to the patients, or to the hospital, for treatment at these Shriner's medical centers. Many local folks have picked up the habit of collecting the pull-tabs and the Freedom Community Church is one of the collection centers. All tabs ultimately result in the same goal.


"The tiny pull-tab is a triple layer of aluminum," Alan Stolz explained, "and not contaminated by that can's contents, easily freed by bending back & forth a few times". Simadi Lodge Shriner members Henry Granahan and Maurice Lamper noted that 5-cents deposit on many beverage cans are not affected, and may be cashed in without the pull-tabs. Gail Stolz announced that Camp Cody's staff would provide refreshments for the occasion, at the couple's home. Friends, family and Cody campers have already left thousands of tabs for this event, including parents whose own youngsters were cared for at the Shriner's hospitals. Many of the bags of pull-tabs have been counted and marked as that collector's scorecard! Major contributors are members of The Rev. Robert "Rip" Ripley's First Congressional Church from NH and Mass. Rev. "Rip's" groups began holding postsummer retreats at Camp Cody, following the regular summer camp season. Alan gave them the "pull-tab story" and they arrived with 2,100 COUNTED tabs a few Augusts ago! That count rose the next season to 41,000 and over 200,000 in 2005. Rev. "Rip" called the Stolz family in mid-spring telling them to expect between a quarter-to-half a MIL-LION COUNTED TABS next week! The crates and wheelbarrows filled with aluminum, are then given in a ceremony to local Shriners, whose members continue their services by delivering tabs that become train car loads for recycle/ smelting centers. Many other children's summer camps have imitated Cody's service efforts, with their members continuing locally when back home again.

The Shriner's Aluminum Tab Collection/Recycle Project began in Springfield, Mass, in 1989, to extend the organization's hospital support. As of last year over a half-million pounds of tabs had been collected! Contributing collectors include churches and synagogues,

service clubs, scout troops, American Legion posts, law enforcement & emergency ambulance units, countless families and businesses. Area folks can start the addictive hobby any time, pocketing tabs at sport events, social gatherings and mealtime, or having a collection bucket at a business. Collections may be donated at Shriner's clubs, the Freedom Church or at Camp Cody, whose staff will see that they are properly delivered to the right place! As Gail & Alan Stolz often chuckle, their guests now include sacks of pull-tabs with any dinner or hospitality gift, and they are frequently flagged down in town and handed a neighbor's collection or find a gift at their front steps! "It's an easy hobby" they are quick to state, urging everyone to get onboard and help the burn/ orthopedic children's care effort. Scottish Rite Masons Will Receive Honors At Chicago Meeting

Chicago...Some 235 Thirty-second Degree Scottish Rite Masons will be elevated to the Thirty-Third Degree in a special ceremony at Chicago on Aug. 29. The event will take place at the conclusion of the Supreme Council of Scottish Rite Freemasonry.

In attendance will be more than 2,000 Thirty-third Degree Masons and their wives form the 15 Northeastern and Midwestern states comprising the 230,000-member Northern Masonic Jurisdiction. This will mark the first time since 1992 that the Supreme Council has met in Chicago.

Those who will be elevated this year were elected a year ago at the annual meeting in Grand Rapids. The Thirty-third Degree is awarded for outstanding achievement within the fraternity or for contributions to others reflecting credit on Freemasonry. The impressive ceremony will be held in the DePaul University Merle Reskin Theatre.

A Vesper Service on Sunday afternoon, Aug. 27, will open the three-day meeting, which will also include executive and general sessions at the Sheraton Chicago Hotel & Towers. Supreme Council members will be joined by leading Freemasons from throughout the United States and around the world.

A major topic of discussion will be the continuing expansion of the Northern Jurisdiction's newest charitable endeavor-the establishment of Thirty-second Degree Masonic Learning Centers for Children designed to provide free one-on-one tutoring for young children with dyslexia. The Scottish Rite Masons also support fellowships in schizophrenia research, college scholarships, and the National Heritage Museum at Lexington, Mass.

Following the conferral of the Thirty-third Degree on Aug. 29, the names of those who have been selected to receive the degree next year at Washington, DC, will be announced.

SPRINGFIELD HOSPITAL REPORT

Here is a short update on the happenings at the Springfield Hospital

The Springfield Hospital Staff and Board of Governors are in the process of developing the 2007 budget for the hospital. Budget guidelines for 2007 have been provided to the hospital from Tampa. The budget is scheduled to be approved by the Board of Governors at the September Board meeting on September 18th and then will be submitted to Tampa by the end of the month.

Donations to the Springfield Hospital through June 2006 were \$244,287 versus \$225,495 for the same period last year. Hopefully, this trend will continue.

The hospital continues to run below budget by \$44,784 or 0.04%. The actual expenditures through June were \$10,780,648 versus a budget of \$10,825,428.

The Springfield Hospital is a very busy place. Through the end of May of 2006, the Springfield Hospital has seen approximately 1,400 New Patients and ranks number one among the 22 Shrine Hospitals in New Patients seen. Also, through the end of May the total number of Outpatients seen by the Springfield Hospital is approximately 8,000, which ranks it as number two in the Shrine Hospital system. While the New Patient count and Outpatient activity is high, the inpatient activity remains low.

The Springfield Hospital conducts their Board meetings on the 3rd Thursday of the month and the meeting is open to all Nobles. The meetings start at 2:00 PM, however, prior to the start of the formal board meeting there is a very informative Patient Presentation by the doctors that is also open to Nobles. If you would like to attend a board meeting, please let me know and I will arrange a tour of the hospital while you are there.
